Investigates reports about abuse, abandonment, neglect, exploitation, and self-neglect of vulnerable adults. The State of Washington defines a vulnerable adult by law as a person who is:

- 60 years of age or older who has the functional, mental, or physical inability to care for himself or herself; or
- Found incapacitated under chapter 11:88 RCW; or
- Who has a developmental disability as defined under RCW 71A.10.020; or
- Admitted to any facility; or
- Receiving services from home health, hospice, or home care agencies licensed or required to be licensed under chapter 70.127 RCW; or
- Who self-directs his or her own care and receives services from a personal aide under chapter 74.39 RCW.

SUICIDE INTERVENTION & PREVENTION

Suicide is the second leading cause of death in the state of Washington. Experts generally agree that suicide and suicidal behaviors are underreported. For every death¹, there are three hospitalizations for self-inflicted injury² and an estimated 225 adults who seriously consider suicide³.

From 2010 to 2014, 5,094 people in Washington lost their lives to suicide. Those who died ranged from 10 to more than 85 years old. Washington's 2013 suicide rate was 14.7 per 100,000 people, 11% higher than the national rate.

In 2020 1,170 known suicide deaths were reported to the Washington State Violent Death Reporting System (WA-VDRS.) From 2010 – 2020 13,365 known* suicide deaths occurred over the 10-year period⁴. According to the NVDRS more than 19,000 people were victims of homicide and almost 45,000 people died by suicide in 2016 Nationwide⁵.

Warning signs of suicide include:

- Changes in eating and sleeping patterns.
- Dropping hints or talking about suicide; making a plan.
- Giving away prized possessions.
- Being very obsessive or perfectionistic.
- Engaging in risky behaviors (driving recklessly, substance use)

Consider the following questions to help you determine the urgency:

- 1. Are there three or more warning signs?
- 2. Have the warning signs been present for two weeks or longer?
- 3. How extreme or severe are the warning signs?

If you are concerned that you or someone you know may be suicidal, it is important to address the situation immediately. Mentioning suicide will not give the person the idea or use push them over the edge. They may feel relieved that someone is willing to talk about what they're thinking and feeling. Sharing your concerns can prevent a suicide attempt from occurring and can save a life.
